


YOUR PHYSICIAN TEAM: BADGE COLORS & SUPERVISION

Level of Responsibility

ATTENDINGS


Physicians who have completed an approved training program in their specialty and may conduct, without supervision, all pertinent aspects of patient care. They supervise fellows, residents, interns, and students.



Physician - Attending

FELLOWS


Physicians enrolled in a post-residency training program to further specialize. They may require supervision for some procedures and function as a supervisor for residents, interns, or students.



Physician - Fellow

RESIDENTS

Physicians “in residency” learning their primary specialty. Depending on their ability level or year in residency, they may require supervision or oversee supervision for other residents, interns, or students.



Physician - Resident

INTERNS


Physicians in training who have completed medical school. An intern has a medical degree but does not have a license to practice medicine unsupervised. They require a supervisor within the hospital.



Physician - Intern

MEDICAL STUDENTS

They are not physicians yet, but are enrolled in a school leading to an M.D. or D.O. medical degree. They can perform procedures if their supervisor is watching them.



Medical - Student
